Spotlight on Bill Metsch

Like many of us, I got interested in magic at a young age after seeing my first magician perform was at my elementary school. I can't recall his name, but he had a pretty assistant that captivated my young mind. They did all the big illusions and as I watched him pull a rabbit out of his hat, I thought to myself "I need to know how it was done".

While at a local mall, I saw a magician doing standup. He put a needle through a balloon, I was so amazed, I ask my mom; How this was possible? Where can I go to learn how to do such? She pointed me towards the library! I checked out some books on magic, and tried to read them, but found them very confusing. I was very disappointed.

Then, while watching a TV show *The Magic of Doug Henning*, I was completely hooked! "I needed to know how everything was done".

My first magic prop was a magic mirror box, a Christmas gift one year, a square paper

Complete Course in Magic. Now I could read and understand everything. Then another book that helped me a great deal was by Bill Tarr, Now You See It, Now You Don't!

Next, I found a magic shop that was close enough to home, I could ride my bike to and from, *Mr. Bills Jokes and Pranks* in OKC. The man inside was full of knowledge, Mr. Bill, how ironic. He showed and taught me magic tricks after school and let me work one summer behind the counter demonstrating tricks for customers. I worked for no pay, just magic tricks and knowledge.

Mr. Bill invited me to an *IBM Ring 46* meeting where I meet some great minds, Seymour Davis being one of them and another duo Love-Hamptine, the act I watched in the mall years before.

My mom performed magic also! Being a single mom with three boys, she joined the IBM and started doing kids birthday parties to make ends meet. It was fine with me as we could bounce magical ideas off one another. We went to all the lectures, *David Ginn* being my first and all magic meetings that we could. I found myself building props as we could not afford to buy them. Having

worked at a magic shop helped in this. The first thing I built for the show was a performance folding table.

Those were good times back then. I performed kids magic on a local cable TV show from time to time, did a show for a governor of OK and performed on the *Jerry Lewis MS TV Marathon*.

The pay from my part-time job, went to buy magic.

At a young age started collecting magic, which I still do to this day.

After getting married I did kid shows, birthday parties, daycares and kid events on the weekend, whenever I could, to make some extra money.

Then I found a group of magicians in Pensacola, the *Gulf Coast Magicians Guild*, a great bunch of people. I promptly joined the *GCMG*, *IBM* and *SAM*. Since then, I have had many great years participating in the club and club related functions, whether it be the round table, shows, meetings, lectures and serving as a club officer.
