Many years ago, when I started performing school assemblies on a regular basis, a pattern developed. Something broke, a button fell off, a screw needed tightening, the microphone batteries went dead, a speaker wire came loose and other things that needed my immediate attention.

So, I created my tool/emergency kit. I started off with a cigar box and eventually went with a regular toolbox.

So, what's in my tool/emergency kit? Screwdrivers, plyers, Scotch tape, electrical tape, extra batteries for my microphone, shoe polish, safety pins, flashlight, sewing kit, paper clips, extra shirt buttons, shirt studs, duct tape, extra wingnuts and bolts for my Zig-Zag Lady and backdrops, thumb tacks, lighter fluid, hand wipes, scissors, razor knife, hair brush, cigarette lighter, Band-Aids, electrical tape, business cards,

Then my brother was in Vegas so after about 5 years in NY I decided it was time for a change. Came to Vegas in 2013 with no idea what I was going to do. Looking for a job, I randomly stopped into Houdini's Magic Shop at the Venetian and found out they were hiring. I put my application in online with my experiences in the IBM and GCMG and within 10 minutes I had a phone call and interview. Started to work for them at the NYNY

location and it was a snowball effect. I never realized how much I knew and understood magic from the years of learning with you guys.

So, I decided to take the next step and start performing. Doing open mics and gathering material, I put together and street busking show and took myself out to Fremont. With street performing and making connections at the shop, magic started to take over my life. I ended up quitting Houdini's and going into full time performing.

I've done local festivals and night clubs all throughout Vegas performing on the same bills as guys like Bizzaro and Chris Kenner (who produces Copperfield).

That all led me to meet a clown with tape on his face. 2016 AGT finalist Tape Face. Who now has a residency at Harrah's in the

House of Tape theater. When he decided to start expanding his show, he liked some of my ideas, as I had been working with him since January. I do an opening 20 minutes before the show, 6 days a week and going strong.

For the future, I'm working on putting together some promo material and taking my own show on the road. I have adopted the stage name of **Tyler Reid, Local Celebrity...**

I can honestly say I wouldn't be anywhere without the time I spent with you guys, and I'm eternally grateful for all my experiences and mentoring I received from the GCMG.
