Make a check list of the tricks you wish to do and put them in the order you will perform them. Add other needs for each trick such a lighter fluid, special cards, or a silk that you will need for that trick. Make sure you include all these extras. It is too late by the time you get to your venue to think of them and have to leave out one of your effects because you didn't bring a key ingredient.

Have your introduction typed out on a small card with the things you want to say about yourself. Make the font large so the MC can read it easily. You do not want them to mispronounce over your name. This is very much appreciated by those having to introduce you.

Spotlight on Bruce Walstad

Bruce Walstad was bitten by the magic bug after seeing Marshall Broden perform the Hippity-Hop Rabbits at a Christmas party in 1959. His very first trick was the classic Ball and Vase. He still has it that same one hidden away in his den. Bruce then ordered a few more tricks and would do little shows for friends and family. His first book on magic was Dunninger's Complete Encyclopedia of Magic, which he read and reread until the pages were worn out.

High school was not the place to perform magic, as it was not cool.... However, by his 19th birthday he was performing birthday party shows.

As the years passed Bruce worked nights in a steel mill, giving him amble time to read,

to his patrol duties, Bruce became "Officer Friendly" and of course, incorporated magic in his safety presentations. rotating shifts gave him the opportunity to try performing school assemblies. He had found his place in magic, performing at elementary schools. From that point on, about Bruce averaged 100 school assemblies each year. Bruce then got a part time job every Saturday demonstrating magic at a local magic shop. It was here, he met many fellow magicians with many becoming lifelong friends.

In 1990, Bruce became a detective and juvenile officer. He continued performing school assemblies, and at Blue and Gold Dinners, Christmas parties, awards banquets and various other events. As time passed, he started performing out of state, taking him to Wisconsin, Michigan, Iowa, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Nevada and Minnesota. Most of these shows were for school assemblies and police related events. Bruce can say he actually performed in the grand ballroom of the Golden Nugget Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, well kind of. He was hired to be the after-dinner keynote speaker for a law

enforcement event and included a couple magic tricks.

During the 70's - 80's and 90's living in the Chicago area, Bruce was very fortunate to get to know some of the magic greats of the Chicagoland area. Their guidance, influence and assistance helped Bruce immensely

shape his shows and performance skills. He was able to see and meet with magicians such as Don Alan, Jay Marshall, Billy Bishop. Ed Marlo, Sam Berland, Dorney and many others. In particular Billy Bishop, Don Alan and Jay Marshall influenced his magic. In this same time frame, Bruce preformed on the Chicago's Bozo's Circus 8 times.

After retiring from the police department in 2001, Bruce moved to the Alabama gulf coast. Shortly after moving here, he became involved with the Pensacola IBM Ring and the SAM Assembly. In 2005, Bruce was involved with the creation of the Gulf Coast magicians Guild and served as president for a few years, until having to step down due to being hired by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, which initially was a very demanding position, having to travel around the country on a weekly basis.

In recent years, Bruce has been performing his complete stage show again with his assistants being three of his grandchildren at various functions in the area. In his opinion, these are the most rewarding show he has ever performed. Granddaughters
